ABOUT THE PROGRAM

TO APPLY

In partnership with The Sacramento Bee, AAJA Sacramento is sponsoring a 10-week, internship program for aspiring print, photo, graphics and multimedia journalists. A weekly stipend of \$570 will be provided. The program begins in May or June 2011, depending on the intern's availability.

To qualify, an applicant must be enrolled in a college or university within the chapter's membership area* OR have a permanent address within those boundaries. Recent graduates who completed their studies in Fall 2010 are also eligible to apply. All applicants must be student members of AAJA Sacramento. (Visit www.aaja.org to become a member.)

AAJA Sacramento will evaluate the initial pool of applicants and nominate two candidates for The Bee's consideration. Applicants are also encouraged to apply for other internships at The Bee. Attach four copies of the following materials to four copies of this form. Use paperclips, not staples, when assembling your application.

The following are required:

- A resume and cover letter.
- A 300-word essay on why diversity still matters in America's newsrooms. Your essay should also mention the qualities and accomplishments you would bring to The Bee and a career in journalism.
- Three to five writing clips or CDs of multimedia work.
- Two letters of reference, at least one from a professor or faculty adviser on school letterhead.

Applications must be *received* by Friday, March 18, 2011.
